1. Chairman's Welcome and Introduction.

To note this meeting has been called by the Chair to allow the Parish Council and residents to view and discuss the proposals from Gressingham Foods Ltd and Centrica Plc for a 17-acre solar farm opposite Gressingham Foods Ltd property.

2. 5. Gressingham Foods Ltd and Centrica Plc proposed 17-acre Solar Farm. Both parties will be in attendance to provide a presentation on their proposals. The proposal is for a 17-acre solar farm on the field opposite Gressingham Foods Ltd property along with solar panels on its roofs. The power gained is to be utilised by Gressingham Foods Ltd.
